- Parent email verification is a part of the application process. It may take 5 minutes to 24 hours for the verification email to be received by the applicant. The application process can be completed once the verification has arrived. Once your application has been entered, the DPI site will list what documentation is needed for you to bring to Redeemer for verification.

- Students are chosen by a lottery system performed by the Department of Public Instruction. If chosen, you will receive a voucher that is paid to Redeemer to cover 100% of tuition
- Completed 2022 tax Information and proof of residency is needed to complete the enrollment eligibility process for new applicants
- Income eligibility set by the state program is based on a family's Adjusted Gross Income; see Income Guideline Chart below
- Families with a student chosen in a previous year need to re-apply and provide proof of residency within the enrollment window

- Preferred (if applicable)- Property Tax Statement
- Current wage statement (can be year-end W2)
- Current water, gas, or electric bill (dated within the last 90 days)
- Current lease agreement
