# **CLASSROOM NEWS**

<u>Preschool:</u> I hope you enjoyed the long weekend! We have another short week this week as there is no school on Friday due to Parent/Teacher conferences.

This week we'll finish our fall theme with some pumpkin fun! Our Bible story this week is a fun one - The Battle of Jericho. Ask your child about how we acted this story out! You can find this story on pages 132-135 of your child's preschool Bible. Thanks for reading it with them!

I am looking forward to meeting with you this week to discuss how your child has been doing to start the school year. Ideally, I would ask that no children come to conferences - it's much easier to have a conversation when it's just adults. However,

if you are unable to make other arrangements, it's fine to bring your child along. Please make sure to bring some activities that will help them stay occupied while we meet. If for some reason you need to change your time, please contact me directly rather than using the sign up link.

Our field trip to the Children's Museum is this Thursday. Please see the special note coming home today regarding details for that trip. Double check that I have your child's information correct. Contact me with any questions!

We're looking forward to seeing all the leaf man projects this week! I hope you enjoyed working on this project with your child. Projects are due back this week - be sure to check them out on display when you come for conferences.

Reading records can come back this week. Watch for the November reading record and class calendar to come home later this week.

Finally, just a reminder that preschoolers do NOT receive a progress report this week. Your child will receive a progress report twice a year - in January and again in May.

**<u>Kindergarten:</u>** Report Cards come home today. Please review all the materials, and then sign *the first line* of the envelope and send only the envelope back tomorrow. Other materials can be brought to conferences for review, if you'd like.

Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held this week, with no school on Friday. See the paper coming home today for a reminder of your day/time. **Grades 5-6:** I hope you had a relaxing four day




